





When you close your eyes and think of the word, "Mentor", who do you think about? Everyone has a different





can make a profound difference in their lives. The fitting quote "AMP UP is the consistency to their inconsistency",

person or experience that they reflect upon, and those thoughts are often accompanied by a smile or a nostalgic chuckle. When thinking back to mentors growing up, I am always drawn to experiences with a former Scoutmaster Donny Wagner and his inspiration to rise and achieve goals.

Donny always seemed to know how to best encourage ways to identify my strengths and weaknesses and always pushed to never let circumstances dictate who I was as a person. He was always there with an enthusiastic "alright!" when I was succeeding and would provide a listening ear whenever I was struggling. Through his consistent positive example and encouragement, I achieved the Eagle Scout rank and not only went to college but was the first in my family to graduate from a university right out of high school. I owe him a lot for who I am today and what I have accomplished.

AMP UP (Alfond Mentoring Program-Uplifting Potential) understands how critical it is to have a positive and consistent adult figure in the lives of children and how even one person

is used when describing what is done at AMP UP. This program works tirelessly to pair vetted community members with the kids at the After School Program at the AYCC. These volunteer mentors are matched with their mentees based on personalities and interests and are asked to invest just one hour per week during a time that works with their schedules. Each of the hour-long match meetings are directly supervised by the Mentor Program Coordinator and the AYCC facility is at your fingertips, working to encourage the positive development of the mentee's social interactions, emotional communication and academic interest.

There are currently over 100 registered children at the AYCC's Afterschool Program, and it is always looking for dedicated individuals who strive to empower future generations and to serve as a positive role model! 
